

What to bring

We want your training experience to be the best. Please prepare yourself with the proper equipment so we can maximize your training time.

Clothing:

It is recommended that you check the weather before you travel for more accurate weather forecast.

Firearms:

Pistol - Any magazine-fed full-size semi-automatic service pistol with a minimal barrel length of 3.5 inches or greater is mandatory. Please don't bring your sub-compact short-barrel semi-autos such as CZ75 RAMI, S&W M&P Shield, etc., for training as these will not be allowed on the firing line. Revolvers are of course permitted but bring plenty of speed loaders. However, the same goes for revolvers as semi-autos in that a barrel length of 3.5" (8.89cm) or greater is mandatory. Snub-nose revolvers such as the Colt Cobra, S&W Model 10, etc., will not be permitted on the firing line.

Ammunition:

Ammunition is the number one cause of weapons malfunctions. Please select a quality round. Reloads or remanufactured ammunition is not recommended.

Range Gear:

Protection – Bring sunscreen and a ball cap (required). Protective eyewear is mandatory. Hearing protection (soft or hard or both) is also mandatory. Electronic hearing protection will enhance your learning experience and is highly recommended.

Cleaning Kit - You will need a cleaning kit for your weapon systems which should minimally include bore brushes, patches, bore jags, cleaning rods, cleaning fluid and lubricant (gun oil or grease) a couple of shop rags and any tools required for maintenance, disassembly and reassembly of your firearms is also recommended.

First Aid Kit – Although each range is equipped w/ a major trauma kit, it is strongly recommended that you bring your own personal snivel kit to include, sunscreen, band aids, new-skin, athletic tape, lip balm, aspirin, whatever medications you may need, reading glasses, etc.

Holster/Magazine pouches/Gun Belt:

Too often student arrive with holsters/magazine pouches/ Belts that are not suitable for serious training. There are quite a number of quality products available. The following

links are examples of suitable equipment. Select any product of comparable quality and you will be fine.
